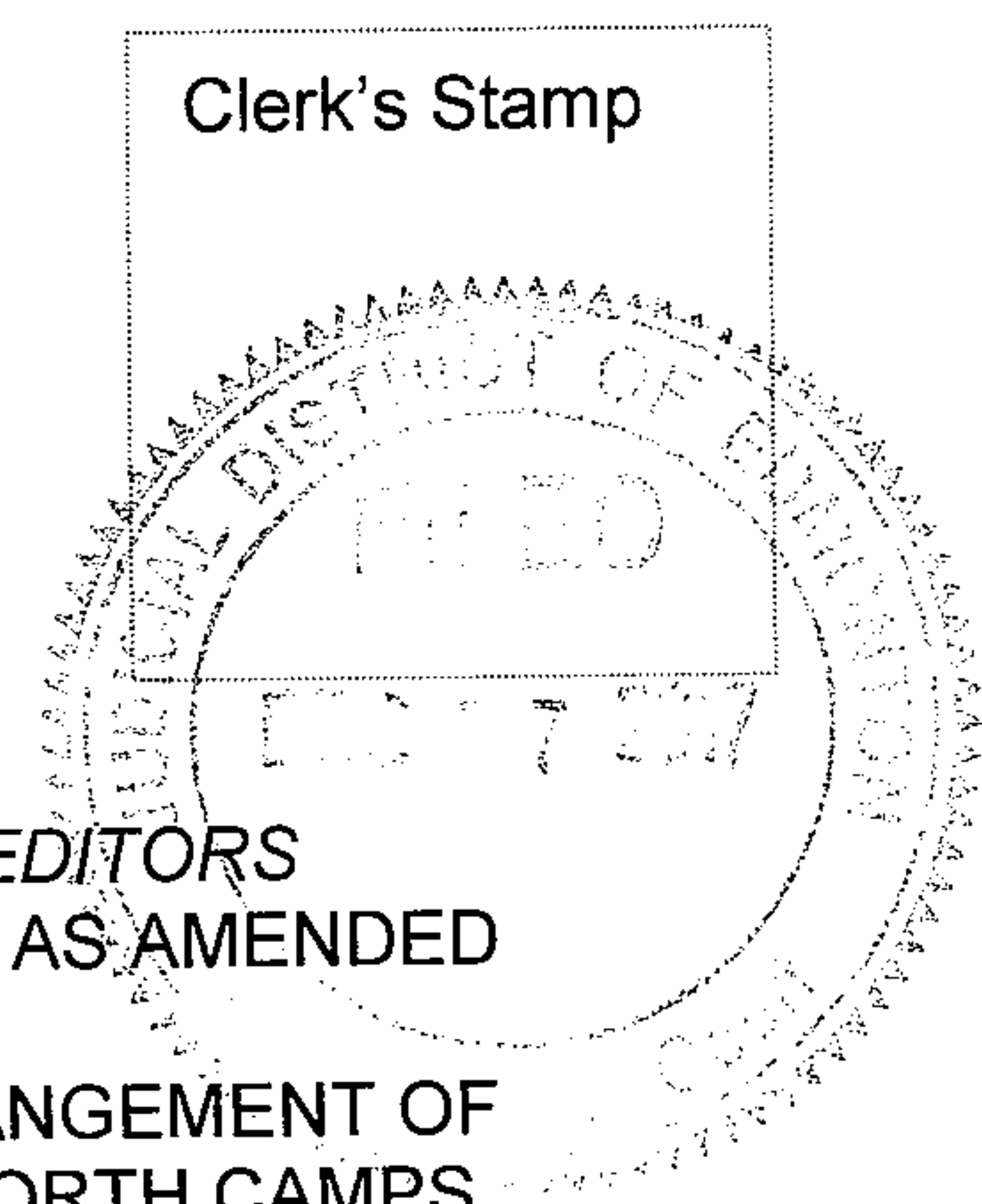

SEVENTH AFFIDAVIT OF SHAYNE McCRACKEN

Sworn on December 7, 2017

I, Shayne McCracken, Businesswoman, of the City of Edmonton, in the Province of Alberta, MAKE OATH
AND SAY THAT:

1. I am a Director and the Secretary of each of the applicants, Canada North Group Inc., Canada North Camps Inc., CampCorp Structures Inc., D.J. Catering Inc., 816956 Alberta Ltd., 1371047 Alberta Ltd., and 1919209 Albert Ltd. (collectively, the "**Companies**") as such, the matters deposed to herein are based on my personal knowledge or on my review of the books and records maintained by the Companies in the ordinary course of their business, entries in which books and records are made reasonably contemporaneously with the Companies' business transactions as they occur, except where stated to be based upon other information and belief, and where so stated, I believe the same to be true.

INTERIM FINANCING REQUEST

2. October and November were difficult weather months for the Companies for the start of the busy camp season. The weather was largely warm and wet, alternating with short freezing periods.
3. As a result of these poor conditions, road bans were in place which affected both the ability of the Companies to move additional facilities into certain camps and the ability of clients to move their people and equipment in to do work in the areas serviced by the camps.
4. As a result, the Companies' clients deferred the bulk of their camp bookings until the roads were consistently open.

5. This is a situation that the Companies have dealt with previously and the Companies have been in discussions with the clients. The clients have confirmed that the work that the clients are in the area to complete has not changed because of the deferred start, it has simply pushed the schedule back.
6. The deferred start to the season for the Companies' busiest camps has meant that there is an increased need for interim financing, as set out in more detail in the financial information attached to the Monitor's Seventh Report.
7. The Companies are further poised to take advantage of the increased demand for camp services this season due to the additional dorms rented for one of its camps. These additional dorms are being installed and connected at the cost of the owner and the rental payments are based on nightly occupancy, which has allowed the Companies to expand capacity without material upfront investment or commitment.
8. The demand for the Companies' camp services in the upcoming season is strong and the provision of the additional interim financing should create additional value for all the stakeholders in this process.
9. The Companies have also continued to work diligently on sales and development of future opportunities and the outlook for the company to operate profitably post-CCAA is positive. Due to the sensitive business nature of this information, this additional information is provided in a confidential supplement to this Affidavit.
10. In connection with this restructuring as a whole, the Companies have also implemented a number of reductions to ongoing operational expenses and continue to work with the Monitor in respect of identifying additional opportunities for streamlining and reduction of expenses.
11. Finally, the Companies also continue to work diligently with a combination of potential investor, equity and financing partners to develop a restructuring plan that will provide for significantly greater recovery for all parties than any alternative scenario.
12. The terms of the additional financing are being finalized with Business Development Bank of Canada. Attached as Exhibit "A" hereto is the draft commitment.
