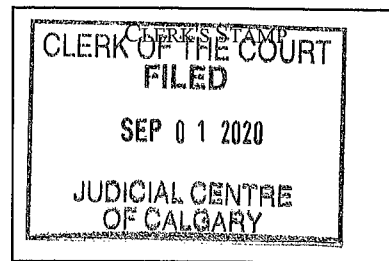

Remedy claimed or sought:

1. On May 14, 2020, Glenogle Energy Inc. and Glenogle Energy LP commenced proposal proceedings under the *Bankruptcy and Insolvency Act*, R.S.C. 1985, c. B-3, as amended (the "**NOI Proceedings**"). As a result of the pandemic and market volatility there is uncertainty as to their ability to have a proposal approved within the statutorily prescribed timeframe.
2. To minimize disruption to their restructuring efforts, the Applicants seek an Initial Order under the *Companies' Creditors Arrangement Act*, R.S.C. 1985, c. C-36 ("**CCAA**"), substantially in the form attached hereto as Schedule "A", granting the following relief:
 - (a) declaring service of this Application and its supporting materials good and sufficient, and if necessary, abridging time for notice of the Application to the time actually given;
 - (b) declaring that the Applicants are companies to which the CCAA applies;
 - (c) authorizing the Applicants and Glenogle Energy LP (collectively "**Glenogle**") to carry on business in a manner consistent with the preservation of their business and property;
 - (d) authorizing the Applicants to pay the reasonable expenses incurred by the Applicants in carrying out its business in the ordinary course, including certain expenses incurred prior to the date of the Initial Order;
 - (e) staying all proceedings, rights and remedies against or in respect of Glenogle or their business or property, or the Monitor (as defined below), except as otherwise set forth in the Initial Order;
 - (f) appointing Ernst & Young Inc. as the monitor (the "**Monitor**") of Glenogle in these proceedings;

- (g) authorizing the Applicants to pay the reasonable fees and disbursements of the Monitor and its counsel and the Applicants' professional advisors and legal advisors;
- (h) granting a Directors' Charge and the Administration Charge;
- (i) recognizing and continuing the Interim Lender's Charge and KERP Charge that were granted by this Honourable Court in the NOI Proceedings, for the purpose of securing the obligations incurred during the NOI Proceedings that are secured by those charges; and
- (j) providing for a comeback hearing in respect of the relief granted in the Initial Order on September 9, 2020; and
- (k) such further and other relief as this Honourable Court may deem just.

Grounds for making this application:

- 3. Glenogle is in the business of oil and gas acquisition, development and production. Glenogle is incorporated and registered pursuant to the laws of the Province of Alberta, with headquarters located in Calgary, Alberta.
- 4. Glenogle operates 80 oil wells and 56 gas wells. Its operations are primarily based in the Province of Alberta, with one well located in the Province of British Columbia.
- 5. The Applicants meet the statutory requirements to be eligible for relief under the CCAA, as the Applicants are insolvent and collectively owe more than \$5,000,000.00 to their creditors.
- 6. As at March 31, 2020, Glenogle had total liabilities of approximately \$130,797,327, including close to \$51 million owing to HSBC Bank Canada ("HSBC"), pursuant to a credit facility. As part of the NOI Proceedings, Glenogle entered into a new loan facility with HSBC which provided, among other things, interim financing during the NOI Proceedings in the amount of \$2.3 million, which is secured by a super-priority Interim Lenders Charge approved by the Court in the NOI Proceedings.

7. Glenogle relies upon the provisions of the CCAA and the equitable jurisdiction of this Court.
8. Such further and other grounds as counsel for Glenogle may advise and this Honourable Court may permit.

UPON the application of Glenogle Energy Inc. and 1651558 Alberta Ltd. (collectively, the "**Applicants**"); **AND UPON** having read the Originating Application, the Affidavit of Jamie Blair sworn on August 31, 2020 (the "**Blair Affidavit**") and the Preliminary Report of the Proposed

Monitor; **AND UPON** reading the consent of Ernst & Young Inc. to act as Monitor; **AND UPON** having read the Affidavits of Jamie Blair and the Reports of the Proposal Trustee filed in the Court of Queen's Bench of Alberta Action Nos. 25-2645392 and 25-2645473 (the "**NOI Proceedings**"); **AND UPON** being advised that the secured creditors who are likely to be affected by the charges created herein have been provided notice of this application and either do not oppose or alternatively consent to the within Order; **AND UPON** hearing counsel for the Applicants, and any other interested parties appearing at the application; **IT IS HEREBY ORDERED AND DECLARED THAT:**

SERVICE

1. The time for service of the notice of application for this order (the "**Order**") is hereby abridged and deemed good and sufficient and this application is properly returnable today.

APPLICATION

2. The Applicants are companies to which the *Companies' Creditors Arrangement Act*, RSC 1985, c C-36 (the "**CCAA**") applies.
3. The NOI Proceedings commenced by the Applicants and Glenogle Energy LP (collectively "**Glenogle**") under Part II of the *Bankruptcy and Insolvency Act* (the "**BIA**") are hereby taken up and continued under the CCAA and the provisions of Part III of the BIA shall have no further application to Glenogle, save that any and all steps, agreements and procedures validly taken, done or entered into by Glenogle during the proposal proceedings, including but not limited to all steps and procedures in connection with:
 - (a) the Financial Advisor Agreement;
 - (b) the Woodrush Account Trust Agreement;
 - (c) the Interim Facility; and
 - (d) the KERP;

(all as defined in the Blair Affidavit) shall remain valid and binding notwithstanding the termination of the NOI Proceedings and the commencement of the within CCAA proceedings.

POSSESSION OF PROPERTY AND OPERATIONS

4. Glenogle shall:

- (a) remain in possession and control of its current and future assets, undertakings and properties of every nature and kind whatsoever, and wherever situate including all proceeds thereof (the "**Property**");
- (b) subject to further order of this Court, continue to carry on business in a manner consistent with the preservation of its business (the "**Business**") and Property; and
- (c) be authorized and empowered to continue to retain and employ the employees, consultants, agents, experts, accountants, counsel and such other persons (collectively "**Assistants**") currently retained or employed by it, with liberty to retain such further Assistants as it deems reasonably necessary or desirable in the ordinary course of business or for the carrying out of the terms of this Order.

5. To the extent permitted by law, the Applicants shall be entitled but not required to make the following advances or payments of the following expenses, incurred prior to or after this Order:

- (a) all outstanding and future wages, salaries, employee and pension benefits, vacation pay and expenses payable on or after the date of this Order, in each case incurred in the ordinary course of business and consistent with existing compensation policies and arrangements; and
- (b) the reasonable fees and disbursements of any Assistants retained or employed by the Applicants in respect of these proceedings, at their standard rates and charges, including for periods prior to the date of this Order.

6. Except as otherwise provided to the contrary herein, the Applicants shall be entitled but not required to pay all reasonable expenses incurred by the Applicants in carrying on the

Business in the ordinary course after this Order, and in carrying out the provisions of this Order, which expenses shall include, without limitation:

- (a) all expenses and capital expenditures reasonably necessary for the preservation of the Property or the Business including, without limitation, payments on account of insurance (including directors and officers insurance), maintenance and security services; and
- (b) payment for goods or services actually supplied to the Applicants since the commencement of the NOI Proceedings.

7. The Applicants shall remit, in accordance with legal requirements, or pay:

- (a) any statutory deemed trust amounts in favour of the Crown in Right of Canada or of any Province thereof or any other taxation authority that are required to be deducted from employees' wages, including, without limitation, amounts in respect of:

- (i) employment insurance,
- (ii) Canada Pension Plan, and
- (iv) income taxes,

but only where such statutory deemed trust amounts have arisen since the commencement of the NOI Proceedings;

- (b) all goods and services or other applicable sales taxes (collectively, "**Sales Taxes**") required to be remitted by the Applicants in connection with the sale of goods and services by the Applicants, but only where such Sales Taxes are accrued or collected after the commencement of the NOI Proceedings; and
- (c) any amount payable to the Crown in Right of Canada or of any Province thereof or any political subdivision thereof or any other taxation authority in respect of municipal realty, municipal business or other taxes, assessments or levies of any nature or kind which are entitled at law to be paid in priority to claims of secured creditors and that are attributable to or in respect of the carrying on of the Business by the Applicants.

8. Until such time as a real property lease is disclaimed or resiliated in accordance with the CCAA, the Applicants may pay all amounts constituting rent or payable as rent under real property leases (including, for greater certainty, common area maintenance charges, utilities and realty taxes and any other amounts payable as rent to the landlord under the lease) based on the terms of existing lease arrangements or as otherwise may be negotiated by the Applicants from time to time for the period after the commencement of the NOI Proceedings ("**Rent**"), but shall not pay any rent in arrears as at the commencement of the NOI Proceedings.
9. Except as specifically permitted in this Order, the Applicants are hereby directed, until further order of this Court:
 - (a) to make no payments of principal, interest thereon or otherwise on account of amounts owing by the Applicants to any of its creditors as of the date of the commencement of the NOI Proceedings;
 - (b) to grant no security interests, trust, liens, charges or encumbrances upon or in respect of any of their Property; and
 - (c) not to grant credit or incur liabilities except in the ordinary course of the Business.

NO PROCEEDINGS AGAINST GLENOGLE OR THE PROPERTY

10. Until and including September 18, 2020, or such later date as this Court may order (the "**Stay Period**"), no proceeding or enforcement process in any court (each, a "**Proceeding**") shall be commenced or continued against or in respect of Glenogle or the Monitor, or affecting the Business or the Property, except with leave of this Court, and any and all Proceedings currently under way against or in respect of Glenogle or affecting the Business or the Property are hereby stayed and suspended pending further order of this Court.

NO EXERCISE OF RIGHTS OR REMEDIES

11. During the Stay Period, all rights and remedies of any individual, firm, corporation, governmental body or agency, or any other entities (all of the foregoing, collectively being "**Persons**" and each being a "**Person**"), whether judicial or extra-judicial, statutory or

non-statutory against or in respect of Glenogle or the Monitor, or affecting the Business or the Property, are hereby stayed and suspended and shall not be commenced, proceeded with or continued except with leave of this Court, provided that nothing in this Order shall:

- (a) empower Glenogle to carry on any business that Glenogle is not lawfully entitled to carry on;
- (b) affect such investigations, actions, suits or proceedings by a regulatory body as are permitted by section 11.1 of the CCAA;
- (c) prevent the filing of any registration to preserve or perfect a security interest;
- (d) prevent the registration of a claim for lien; or
- (e) exempt Glenogle from compliance with statutory or regulatory provisions relating to health, safety or the environment.

12. Nothing in this Order shall prevent any party from taking an action against Glenogle where such an action must be taken in order to comply with statutory time limitations in order to preserve their rights at law, provided that no further steps shall be taken by such party except in accordance with the other provisions of this Order, and notice in writing of such action be given to the Monitor at the first available opportunity.

NO INTERFERENCE WITH RIGHTS

13. During the Stay Period, no person shall accelerate, suspend, discontinue, fail to honour, alter, interfere with, repudiate, terminate or cease to perform any right, renewal right, contract, agreement, licence or permit in favour of or held by Glenogle, except with the written consent of Glenogle and the Monitor, or leave of this Court.

CONTINUATION OF SERVICES

14. During the Stay Period, all persons having:
- (a) statutory or regulatory mandates for the supply of goods and/or services; or
 - (b) oral or written agreements or arrangements with Glenogle, including without limitation all computer software, communication and other data services,

centralized banking services, payroll services, insurance, transportation, services, utility or other services to the Business or Glenogle;

are hereby restrained until further order of this Court from discontinuing, altering, interfering with, suspending or terminating the supply of such goods or services as may be required by Glenogle or exercising any other remedy provided under such agreements or arrangements. Glenogle shall be entitled to the continued use of their current premises, telephone numbers, facsimile numbers, internet addresses and domain names, provided in each case that the usual prices or charges for all such goods or services received after the date of this Order are paid by Glenogle in accordance with the payment practices of Glenogle, or such other practices as may be agreed upon by the supplier or service provider and each of Glenogle and the Monitor, or as may be ordered by this Court.

NON-DEROGATION OF RIGHTS

15. Nothing in this Order has the effect of prohibiting a person from requiring immediate payment for goods, services, use of leased or licensed property or other valuable consideration provided on or after the date of this Order, nor shall any person, other than the Interim Lender where applicable, be under any obligation on or after the date of this Order to advance or re-advance any monies or otherwise extend any credit to Glenogle.

PROCEEDINGS AGAINST DIRECTORS AND OFFICERS

16. During the Stay Period, and except as permitted by subsection 11.03(2) of the CCAA and paragraph 12 of this Order, no Proceeding may be commenced or continued against any of the former, current or future directors or officers of the Applicants with respect to any claim against the directors or officers that arose before the date of this Order and that relates to any obligations of the Applicants whereby the directors or officers are alleged under any law to be liable in their capacity as directors or officers for the payment or performance of such obligations, until a compromise or arrangement in respect of the Applicants, if one is filed, is sanctioned by this Court or is refused by the creditors of the Applicants or this Court.

DIRECTORS' AND OFFICERS' INDEMNIFICATION AND CHARGE

17. The Applicants shall indemnify its directors and officers against obligations and liabilities that they may incur as directors and or officers of the Applicants after the commencement of the within proceedings except to the extent that, with respect to any officer or director, the obligation was incurred as a result of the director's or officer's gross negligence or wilful misconduct.
18. The directors and officers of the Applicants shall be entitled to the benefit of and are hereby granted a charge (the "**Directors' Charge**") on the Property, which charge shall not exceed an aggregate amount of \$100,000, as security for the indemnity provided in paragraph 17 of this Order. The Directors' Charge shall have the priority set out in paragraphs 31 and 33 herein.
19. Notwithstanding any language in any applicable insurance policy to the contrary:
 - (a) no insurer shall be entitled to be subrogated to or claim the benefit of the Directors' Charge; and
 - (b) the Applicants' directors and officers shall only be entitled to the benefit of the Directors' Charge to the extent that they do not have coverage under any directors' and officers' insurance policy, or to the extent that such coverage is insufficient to pay amounts indemnified in accordance with paragraph 17 of this Order.

APPOINTMENT OF MONITOR

20. Ernst & Young Inc. is hereby appointed pursuant to the CCAA as the Monitor, an officer of this Court, to monitor the Property, Business, and financial affairs of Glenogle with the powers and obligations set out in the CCAA or set forth herein and that the Applicants and their shareholders, officers, directors, and Assistants shall advise the Monitor of all material steps taken by the Applicants pursuant to this Order, and shall co-operate fully with the Monitor in the exercise of its powers and discharge of its obligations and provide the Monitor with the assistance that is necessary to enable the Monitor to adequately carry out the Monitor's functions.

21. The Monitor, in addition to its prescribed rights and obligations under the CCAA, is hereby directed and empowered to:
- (a) monitor the Applicants' receipts and disbursements, Business and dealings with the Property;
 - (b) report to this Court at such times and intervals as the Monitor may deem appropriate with respect to matters relating to the Property, the Business, and such other matters as may be relevant to the proceedings herein and immediately report to the Court if in the opinion of the Monitor there is a material adverse change in the financial circumstances of the Applicants;
 - (c) assist the Applicants, to the extent required by the Applicants, in its dissemination to the Interim Lender and its counsel, financial and other information as agreed to between the Applicants and the Interim Lender which may be used in these proceedings, including reporting on a basis as reasonably required by the Interim Lender;
 - (d) advise the Applicants in its preparation of the Applicants' cash flow statements and reporting required by the Interim Lender, which information shall be reviewed with the Monitor and delivered to the Interim Lender on a regular basis, in accordance with the New Facility Letter and as agreed to by the Interim Lender;
 - (e) advise the Applicants in their development of the Plan and any amendments to the Plan;
 - (f) assist the Applicants, to the extent required by the Applicants, with the holding and administering of creditors' or shareholders' meetings for voting on the Plan;
 - (g) have full and complete access to the Property, including the premises, books, records, data, including data in electronic form and other financial documents of the Applicants to the extent that is necessary to adequately assess the Property, Business, and financial affairs of the Applicants or to perform its duties arising under this Order;

- (h) be at liberty to engage independent legal counsel or such other persons as the Monitor deems necessary or advisable respecting the exercise of its powers and performance of its obligations under this Order;
 - (i) hold funds in trust or in escrow, to the extent required, to facilitate settlements between the Applicant and any other Person; and
 - (j) perform such other duties as are required by this Order or by this Court from time to time.
22. The Monitor shall not take possession of the Property and shall take no part whatsoever in the management or supervision of the management of the Business and shall not, by fulfilling its obligations hereunder, or by inadvertence in relation to the due exercise of powers or performance of duties under this Order, be deemed to have taken or maintain possession or control of the Business or Property, or any part thereof. Nothing in this Order shall require the Monitor to occupy or to take control, care, charge, possession or management of any of the Property that might be environmentally contaminated, or might cause or contribute to a spill, discharge, release or deposit of a substance contrary to any federal, provincial or other law respecting the protection, conservation, enhancement, remediation or rehabilitation of the environment or relating to the disposal or waste or other contamination, provided however that this Order does not exempt the Monitor from any duty to report or make disclosure imposed by applicable environmental legislation or regulation. The Monitor shall not, as a result of this Order or anything done in pursuance of the Monitor's duties and powers under this Order be deemed to be in possession of any of the Property within the meaning of any federal or provincial environmental legislation.
23. The Monitor shall provide any creditor of the Applicants, including the Interim Lender, with information provided by the Applicants in response to reasonable requests for information made in writing by such creditor addressed to the Monitor. The Monitor shall not have any responsibility or liability with respect to the information disseminated by it pursuant to this paragraph. In the case of information that the Monitor has been advised by the Applicants is confidential, the Monitor shall not provide such information to creditors

unless otherwise directed by this Court or on such terms as the Monitor and the Applicants may agree.

24. In addition to the rights and protections afforded the Monitor under the CCAA or as an Officer of this Court, the Monitor shall incur no liability or obligation as a result of its appointment or the carrying out of the provisions of this Order, save and except for any gross negligence or wilful misconduct on its part. Nothing in this Order shall derogate from the protections afforded the Monitor by the CCAA or any applicable legislation.
25. The Monitor, counsel to the Monitor, and counsel to the Applicants shall be paid their reasonable fees and disbursements (including any pre-filing fees and disbursements related to these CCAA proceedings or the NOI Proceedings), in each case at their standard rates and charges, by the Applicants as part of the costs of these proceedings. The Applicants are hereby authorized and directed to pay the accounts of the Monitor, counsel for the Monitor and counsel for the Applicants on a bi-weekly basis and, in addition, the Applicants are hereby authorized to pay to the Monitor, counsel to the Monitor, and counsel to the Applicants, retainers in accordance with such parties' retainer agreements, to be held by them as security for payment of their respective fees and disbursements outstanding from time to time.
26. The Monitor and its legal counsel shall pass their accounts from time to time.
27. The Monitor, counsel to the Monitor, if any, and the Applicant's counsel, as security for the professional fees and disbursements incurred both before and after the granting of this Order, shall be entitled to the benefits of and are hereby granted a charge (the "**Administration Charge**") on the Property, which charge shall not exceed an aggregate amount of \$500,000 as security for their professional fees and disbursements incurred at the normal rates and charges of the Monitor and such counsel, both before and after the making of this Order in respect of these proceedings. The Administration Charge shall have the priority set out in paragraphs 31 and 33 hereof.

INTERIM FINANCING

28. Pursuant to section 11.6 of the CCAA, the Interim Lender's Charge granted with respect to the Applicants in the NOI Proceedings on June 12, 2020 is hereby taken up and continued in these proceedings. Notwithstanding paragraph 3 of this Order, the Interim Lender's Charge shall remain in full force and effect as set out herein, and shall validly charge all amounts advanced to date pursuant to the Interim Facility, pending the Comeback Hearing (as defined below).
29. The Interim Lender shall be treated as unaffected in any plan of arrangement or compromise filed by the Applicants under the CCAA, or any proposal filed by the Applicants under the *Bankruptcy and Insolvency Act* of Canada (the "**BIA**"), with respect to any advances made under the amended and restated credit facility letter dated as of June 10, 2020 (the "**Interim Financing Agreement**") as among the Applicants and HSBC (in such capacity, the "**Interim Lender**") or such credit agreements, mortgages, charges, hypothecs, security documents, guarantees and other definitive documents (the "**Definitive Documents**") as are contemplated by the Interim Financing Agreement or as may be reasonably required by the Interim Lender.

KERP

30. Pursuant to section 11.6 of the CCAA, the KERP Charge granted with respect to the Applicants in the NOI Proceedings on June 12, 2020 is taken up and continued in these proceedings. Notwithstanding paragraph 3 of this Order, the KERP Charge shall remain in full force and effect as set out herein, and shall validly charge all amounts earned to date pursuant to the KERP, pending the Comeback Hearing (as defined below). The KERP Charge shall have the priority set out in paragraphs 31 and 33 hereof.

VALIDITY AND PRIORITY OF CHARGES

31. The priorities of the Administration Charge, the Interim Lender's Charge, the KERP Charge and the Directors' Charge, as among them, shall be as follows:
- First – Administration Charge (to the maximum amount of \$500,000);

Second – Interim Lender's Charge (in the amount of \$2.3 million);

Third – KERP Charge;

Fourth – Directors' Charge (to the maximum amount of \$100,000).

32. The filing, registration or perfection of the Administration Charge, the Interim Lender's Charge, the KERP Charge and the Directors' Charge (collectively, the "**Charges**") shall not be required, and the Charges shall be valid and enforceable for all purposes, including as against any right, title or interest filed, registered, recorded or perfected subsequent to the Charges coming into existence, notwithstanding any such failure to file, register, record or perfect.
33. Each of the Charges (all as constituted and defined herein) shall constitute a charge on the Property and subject always to section 34(11) of the CCAA such Charges shall rank in priority to the security of all secured creditors who have been given notice of this application, but behind all other security interests, trusts, liens, charges and encumbrances, and claims of secured creditors, statutory or otherwise (collectively, "**Encumbrances**") in favour of any Person that has not been served with notice of this application. The Applicants and beneficiaries of the Charges shall be entitled to seek priority ahead of the Encumbrances on notice to those parties likely to be affected by such priority (it being the intention of the Applicants to seek priority of the Charges ahead of all such Encumbrances) at the Comeback Hearing (as defined below).
34. Except as otherwise expressly provided for herein, or as may be approved by this Court, the Applicants shall not grant any Encumbrances over any Property that rank in priority to, or *pari passu* with, any of the Charges unless the Applicants also obtain the prior written consent of the Monitor and the beneficiaries of Charges, or further order of this Court.
35. The Directors' Charge and the Administration Charge, the Definitive Documents, and the Interim Lender's Charge shall not be rendered invalid or unenforceable and the rights and remedies of the chargees entitled to the benefit of the Charges (collectively, the "**Chargees**") and/or the Interim Lender thereunder shall not otherwise be limited or impaired in any way by:

- (a) the pendency of these proceedings and the declarations of insolvency made in this Order;
- (b) any application(s) for bankruptcy order(s) issued pursuant to BIA, or any bankruptcy order made pursuant to such applications;
- (c) the filing of any assignments for the general benefit of creditors made pursuant to the BIA;
- (d) the provisions of any federal or provincial statutes; or
- (e) any negative covenants, prohibitions or other similar provisions with respect to borrowings, incurring debt or the creation of Encumbrances, contained in any existing loan documents, lease, sublease, offer to lease or other agreement (collectively, an "**Agreement**") that binds the Applicants, and notwithstanding any provision to the contrary in any Agreement:
 - (i) neither the creation of the Charges nor the execution, delivery, perfection, registration or performance of any documents in respect thereof, including the New Facility Letter or the Definitive Documents, shall create or be deemed to constitute a new breach by the Applicants of any Agreement to which it is a party;
 - (ii) none of the Chargees shall have any liability to any Person whatsoever as a result of any breach of any Agreement caused by or resulting from the creation of the Charges, the Applicants execution, delivery or performance of the New Facility Letter or the Definitive Documents; and
 - (iii) the payments made by the Applicants pursuant to this Order, including pursuant to the New Facility Letter or the Definitive Documents, and the granting of the Charges do not and will not constitute preferences, fraudulent conveyances, transfers at undervalue, oppressive conduct or other challengeable or voidable transactions under any applicable law.

ALLOCATION

36. Any interested Person may apply to this Court on notice to any other party likely to be affected for an order to allocate the Charges amongst the various assets comprising the Property.

SERVICE AND NOTICE

37. The Monitor shall (i) without delay, publish in the Daily Oil Bulletin a notice containing the information prescribed under the CCAA; (ii) within five (5) days after the date of this Order (A) make this Order publicly available in the manner prescribed under the CCAA, (B) send, in the prescribed manner, a notice to every known creditor who has a claim against either of the Applicant of more than \$1,000 and (C) prepare a list showing the names and addresses of those creditors and the estimated amounts of those claims, and make it publicly available in the prescribed manner, all in accordance with section 23(1)(a) of the CCAA and the regulations made thereunder.
38. The Monitor shall establish a case website in respect of the within proceedings at www.ey.com/ca/glenogleenergy (the "**Monitor's Website**").
39. The Applicants and the Monitor are at liberty to serve this Order, any other materials and orders in these proceedings, any notices or other correspondence, by forwarding true copies thereof by prepaid ordinary mail, courier, personal delivery or electronic transmission to the Applicants' creditors or other interested parties at their respective addresses as last shown on the records of the Applicants and that any such service or notice by courier, personal delivery or electronic transmission shall be deemed to be received on the next business day following the date of forwarding thereof, or if sent by ordinary mail, on the third business day after mailing. Any person that wishes to be served with any application and other materials in these proceedings must deliver to the Applicants and the Monitor by way of ordinary mail, courier, or electronic transmission, a request to be added to the service list (the "**Service List**") to be maintained by the Monitor.
40. Any party to these proceedings may serve any court materials in these proceedings by emailing a PDF or other electronic copy of such materials to counsel's email addresses as

recorded on the Service List from time to time, and the Monitor shall post a copy of all prescribed materials on the Monitor's website.

41. The Applicants and, where applicable, the Monitor are at liberty to serve this Order, any other materials and orders in these proceedings, any notices or other correspondence, by sending true copies thereof by prepaid ordinary mail, courier, personal delivery or electronic transmission to the Applicants' creditors or other interested parties at their respective addresses last shown on the records of the Applicant, or as otherwise updated on the Service List.
42. An application in these proceedings is hereby scheduled to be heard before this Honourable Court at 3:30 p.m. on September 9, 2020 (the "**Comeback Hearing**"). The Applicants are entitled to serve any court materials in connection with the Comeback Hearing on the Service List by courier, personal delivery or electronic transmission in accordance with this Order.

GENERAL

43. The Applicant or the Monitor may from time to time apply to this Court for advice and directions in the discharge of their powers and duties hereunder.
44. Notwithstanding Rule 6.11 of the *Alberta Rules of Court*, unless otherwise ordered by this Court, the Monitor will report to the Court from time to time, which reporting is not required to be in affidavit form and shall be considered by this Court as evidence. The Monitor's reports shall be filed by the Court Clerk notwithstanding that they do not include an original signature.
45. Nothing in this Order shall prevent the Monitor from acting as an interim receiver, a receiver, a receiver and manager or a trustee in bankruptcy of the Applicants, the Business or the Property.
46. This Court hereby requests the aid and recognition of any court, tribunal, regulatory or administrative body having jurisdiction in Canada or in any foreign jurisdiction, to give effect to this Order and to assist the Applicants, the Monitor and their respective agents in

carrying out the terms of this Order. All courts, tribunals, regulatory and administrative bodies are hereby respectfully requested to make such orders and to provide such assistance to the Applicants and to the Monitor, as an officer of this Court, as may be necessary or desirable to give effect to this Order, to grant representative status to the Monitor in any foreign proceeding, or to assist the Applicants and the Monitor and their respective agents in carrying out the terms of this Order.

47. The Applicants and the Monitor be at liberty and are hereby authorized and empowered to apply to any court, tribunal, regulatory or administrative body, wherever located, for the recognition of this Order and for assistance in carrying out the terms of this Order and that the Monitor is authorized and empowered to act as a representative in respect of the within proceeding for the purpose of having these proceedings recognized in a jurisdiction outside Canada.
48. Any interested party (including the Applicants and the Monitor) may apply to this Court to vary or amend this Order on not less than seven (7) days' notice to any other party or parties likely to be affected by the order sought or upon such other notice, if any, as this Court may order.
49. This Order and all of its provisions are effective as of 12:01 a.m. Mountain Daylight Time on the date of this Order.
