STAY EXTENSION ORDER

THIS MOTION, made by the Applicants pursuant to the *Companies' Creditors Arrangement Act*, R.S.C. 1985, c. C-36, as amended (the “**CCAA**”), for an order, among other things, (i) extending the stay of proceedings *nunc pro tunc* from August 9, 2024 up to and including the earlier of (1) the delivery of the Monitor’s certificate (as defined below); and (2) September 27, 2024; and (ii) approving the Eighth Report of Ernst & Young Inc., in its capacity as monitor of the Applicants (the “**Monitor**”) dated August 1, 2024 (the “**Eighth Report**”), and the activities, conduct and decisions of the Monitor described therein, was heard this day by Zoom videoconference,

ON READING the Motion Record of the Applicants and the Eighth Report, and on hearing the submissions of counsel for the Applicants, counsel for the Monitor, counsel for the secured lenders, and those other parties appearing as indicated by the counsel slip, no one appearing for any other person on the service list, although properly served as appears from the Affidavit of Service filed,

SERVICE

1. **THIS COURT ORDERS** that the time for service of the Notice of Motion and the Motion Record is hereby abridged and validated so that this Motion is properly returnable today and hereby dispenses with further service thereof.

DEFINITIONS

2. **THIS COURT ORDERS** that unless otherwise indicated or defined herein, capitalized terms have the meanings given to them in the Affidavit of Dr. Brigitte Simons sworn August 15, 2024 (the “**Ninth Simons Affidavit**”) or the Approval and Reverse Vesting Order dated May 7, 2024 (the “**Approval and Reverse Vesting Order**”)

EXTENSION OF STAY PERIOD

3. **THIS COURT ORDERS** that the Stay Period is hereby extended *nunc pro tunc* from August 9, 2024 up to and including the earlier of: (1) the delivery of the Monitor’s Certificate the “**Monitor’s Certificate**”) substantially in the form attached as Schedule “A” to the Approval and Reverse Vesting Order; and (2) September 27, 2024.

APPROVAL OF MONITOR’S EIGHTH REPORT

4. **THIS COURT ORDERS** that the Eighth Report of the Monitor, and the activities, conduct and decisions of the Monitor as set out therein are hereby ratified and approved, provided that only the Monitor, in its personal capacity and only with respect to its own personal liability shall be entitled to rely upon or utilize in any way such approval.

GENERAL

5. **THIS COURT HEREBY REQUESTS** the aid and recognition of any court, tribunal, regulatory or administrative body having jurisdiction in Canada, the United States or elsewhere, to give effect to this Order and to assist the Applicants, the Monitor and their respective agents in carrying out the terms of this Order. All courts, tribunals, regulatory and administrative bodies are hereby respectfully requested to make such orders and to provide such assistance to the Applicants and to the Monitor, as an officer of this Court, as may be necessary or desirable to give effect to this Order, to grant representative status to the Monitor in any foreign proceeding, or to assist the Applicants and the Monitor and their respective agents in carrying out the terms of this Order.

6. **THIS COURT ORDERS** that each of the Applicants and the Monitor be at liberty and is hereby authorized and empowered to apply to any court, tribunal, regulatory or administrative body, wherever located, for the recognition of this Order and for assistance in carrying out the terms of this Order, and that the Monitor is authorized and empowered to act as a representative in respect of the within proceedings for the purpose of having these proceedings recognized in a jurisdiction outside Canada.

7. **THIS COURT ORDERS** that this Order is effective from the date that it is made and is enforceable without any need for entry and filing.
